PRINCIPAL'S POINT OF VIEW

On May 25th, the Academy's tenth graduating class crossed the stage at Lake City Community Church to receive their diplomas. These forty-five graduates, nineteen of whom completed all seven of their middle-school and high-school years at the Academy, received scholarship offers in excess of 3.2 MILLION dollars, and are headed off to all parts of the country and overseas. Congratulations to them all! We will miss them.

The class of 2011 serves as a great example of the value of hard work and avid participation in school activities. Their admission into the top colleges and universities in the country, as well as their unprecedented scholarship offers, are indicators that our graduates are exceptionally well rounded. Not only do they receive an outstanding academic preparation, but they also enjoy far more opportunities for leadership and participation than students in larger schools.

Here are some facts to consider:

The average scholarship amount for a member of this year's class is approximately \$71,000.

Fifteen of our graduates (that's one third of them) received at least one (individual) scholarship offer of over \$30,000.

The class of 2011 included three National Merit Scholarship finalists.

And, finally, with last week's release of the Washington Post's annual ranking of top schools in the country (formerly the Newsweek ranking), the Academy realized a significant jump, from #282 last year to #129 out of over 20,000 high schools in the country. This is strong evidence of our continuing efforts to improve on an already successful educational package. Selective colleges and universities take into account the quality of the schools their applicants attend, so our students benefit substantially from their choice to persevere at the Academy. I would be remiss if I neglected to thank their families, who supported them through their years with us. Thank you!

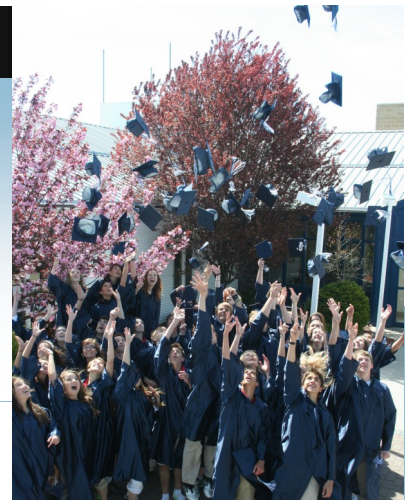

NATIONAL SCIENCE BOWL

The Coeur d'Alene Charter Academy recently competed in the National Science Bowl (NSB) in Washington, DC. Sixty-eight teams competed in eight divisions, with the top two teams from each division advancing to the final, double-elimination tournament. The Academy team placed second in their division and advanced to the top sixteen. Only three teams from Idaho have ever accomplished this in over

twenty years of competition. A highlight of the competition was beating out perennial powerhouse and many-time champion, Thomas Jefferson High School for Science and Technology, to reach the finals. Charter's placement in the top sixteen earns them national recognition and \$1,000 to be used toward advancing math and science at the Academy. The team of Steven Hallgren, Lewis Ellis, Mitch Shellman, Jonah Grubb, and Michael Harlan was coached by Darren Gabrielsen and Frank Hallett.

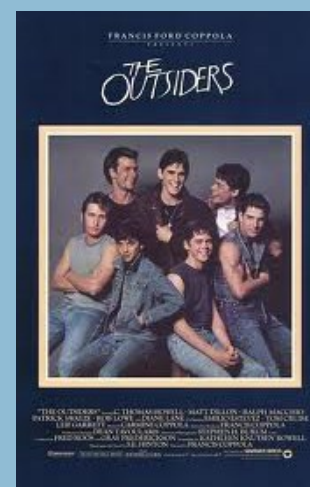

STATE PROJECT CITIZEN SHOWCASE

Five girls from the Charter Academy are making their mark in United States public policy. Clare Dumont, Jenny Iiams, Patty Iiams, Hannah Meyers, and Anna Verhaeghe put together a phenomenal project for their Project Citizen civics project. Project Citizen is a way for students to learn how public policy is created or reformed in the U.S. system of government. The team chose to focus on drug trafficking and security along the U.S./Mexican border. They advocated a policy of using gravimeters as a way to find tunnels that drug traffickers use to bring drugs into the U.S. and to increase the use of drug sniffing canines at border checkpoints. The girls presented their project in the State Project Citizen Showcase in Boise on May 6th. Their project was chosen to represent the State of

Idaho in the National Showcase this summer in California. Additionally, they drafted a cover letter and sent their ideas to the Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA) of the U.S. Government. A few days ago, Mr. Tony Ryan, executive assistant to Mr. Harrigan, DEA Chief of Western Operations, contacted them and the girls are currently in discussion about their public policy recommendation. This is very exciting and we hope to have something more to tell in the weeks ahead!

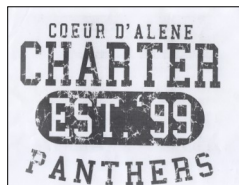

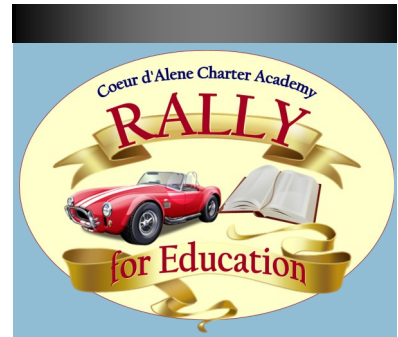
